

#### **FROM THE PARISH PRIEST**

Dear Parish Family,

What a wonderful week with our parish families with so many events centring around our young people. I've attended all but one school now and either celebrated a beginning the year Mass, a liturgy for the start of the school year or an awards



ceremony. A couple of times I even managed a second visit. I've loved the beautiful way our liturgies have been prepared which has helped our young people participate. I've also been heartened by the numbers of parents, particularly those of student leaders, who have attended, to support the values and ministry of our school communities. It has been heart-warming. Sometimes we don't see it as clearly in them, but our young people are very spiritual and often (even as they fight it) have a faith that runs deep. Our kids sang and prayed with extraordinary joy it seemed to me. It gives me hope.

And Epic, the parish young person's group, celebrated its one-year anniversary! I attended a lovely celebration on the 19<sup>th</sup> to mark the occasion.

I don't think we need to be afraid to have faith conversations with our young people. I am always prepared for the push back or the challenge. It excites me. It means that there are questions permeating in their hearts as well as their minds. Questions are good! And doubts, looking for proofs, challenging the status quo can lead us to a deeper understanding of our own relationship with Christ. Never be afraid to say, 'I don't know the answer to that.' There is more I don't know than I do know. That is the immensity and reality of our God and our faith. Remember faith is heart even when we try to explain it from our head.

It is also time for us to begin another part of the journey with our young people through the sacrament process. I've stopped using the word 'programme': 'process' isn't exactly right either as both have a bit of a finite sense to them which sometimes reflects 'getting them done' and once they 'are done' they are finished. I never want them to think they are ever 'finished.' Process at least suggests that they and we with them are on a bit of a journey and importantly a life-long journey. For those of us a bit older we can reflect on those moments we faced difficulty or challenge and got through due to the support of our faith. It is what we should want our kids to know and hear, often. **Nothing** is too big they can't face, with God's help and ours.

The church moved away years ago from two things about the sacrament preparation journey. Firstly, we took the preparation out of our schools. Some of you may think we've stopped teaching religion. In reality, we've been stepping it up. You will hear us talk about 'School Supported, Parish Based and Family Centred' not necessarily in that order. The other thing we did was make it more accessible and less age based. We are going now with readiness rather than age specific although kids should be over seven, the general age of reason, to begin Reconciliation. They must be able to understand that they are sorry for the action not just because they 'got caught.' Boys are slower to come to that than girls. The sacrament process is now open for enrolment.

Our lives, like the seasons, are constantly changing. These changes often involve many losses and deep grief. Learning how to recognise and adapt to

the stressful events and changed circumstances we experience, as well as the ongoing challenges these may bring, helps to bring peace and hope into our lives.

The Seasons for Growth small group, peer-based educational program offers the opportunity for individual reflection and group discussion by gently and symbolically using the metaphor of the seasons to support adults to:

• **Learn** about how different people respond to change, loss and grief

• **Understand** that it is normal to experience a range of grief reactions

• **Explore** new approaches to dealing with change, loss and grief in their lives

• **Build** communication, decision making and problem solving skills

• **Participate** in a supportive network of peers and adults

• **Integrate** their new learning into their relationships with family, friends and others.

## LATEST NEWS FROM OUR SAFEGUARDING PROMOTERS

The Promoters of Safeguarding continue to endorse a culture of safeguarding within the Parish. To this end, your attention is drawn to the **importance of men's sheds in supporting mental health**.

Following its 1993 foundation in Goolwa, South Australia, there are now over 1,200 men's sheds Australia-wide with over 50,000 members. These sheds play a crucial role in supporting mental health, offering a unique space for men to connect, share, and engage in meaningful activities.

Sheds serve as community hubs where men can gather to work shoulder-to-shoulder, mainly on wood and metal work projects, developing new skills shown to reduce stress and improve overall well-being. The social aspect of men's sheds helps reduce feelings of isolation, a common issue for many men, particularly in older age or during times of life transition when leaving the paid workforce often means leaving their social network. The 'shed' is a great equaliser – it doesn't matter how important you once were.


