HISTORICAL CONTEXT—EXPECTATION

When the gospel of Mark was written around the year 75 of the 1st Century, the people of that community firmly believed that the world was about to end and that Jesus' return to earth was going to happen any day. Another 10 or so years later, the communities of the gospels of Matthew and Luke were enduring persecution and great hardship. They felt that surviving through this time of struggle would be rewarded with the return of Jesus. However, by the time of the gospel of John, another 10 years later, we see an acceptance that the end is still to come some time in the future.

Conversation Questions:

Has there been a time when you turned to God when you were afraid? What did you do? How did it feel to know that God was with you?

FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



Dear Parish Family,

I was thrilled with how Fr Anton's ordination went last Saturday. A great gathering of the catholic clan. Everything went to plan due to the extraordinary commitment of all those who signed up as a volunteer, from the sacristy to the carpark attendants. No visible glitches to the naked eye were perceived. I know Anton was thrilled. As he reflected it has been a long time coming; 16 years from entry to ordination. It would be a mistake to think that the ordination was the end of either the learning or the formation. I personally learnt more about the craft that is the priesthood post ordination than I did in the seminary. Theory is one thing, practice another. I hope that Anton has a long and fruitful journey as a priest of this diocese. A journey full of learning and encounter with all of us and with the God who loves us.

I feel fortunate and blessed to have an opportunity this weekend to travel to Sri Lanka and to join with Fr Tony Potts and Anton's family and friends in gatherings marking Anton's ordination. Whilst never easy for anyone I know Anton will feel at different times deeply the wrench from home imbedded in his decision to minister here. It is important to acknowledge his roots and the family and friends that have helped nurture his vocation to the priesthood. You may be aware in the last twelve months both Anton's mum and dad have died. How hard for every migrant or refugee at times like those. I know many of you have felt that keenly in your own lives and will very personally empathise with Fr Anton. It is never easy even for people of faith.

You might spend a moment or two in prayer for the success of the celebrations in Sri Lanka and our safe return.

As a church we will always need priests. What they might look like or be like into the future is a very different question. However, we are and will always be Eucharistic in our heart, our nature and our church. The Body and Blood of Christ fundamental to our belief in Salvation. We are nothing without the Last Supper or the Crucifixion. They are integral to our understanding of what it means to be saved. We will always need priests. And encourage your children and grandchildren to think at least about religious life. It is a wonderful vocation! Pray for our priests and pray for vocations to the priesthood, and religious life.

As we gather each Sunday in our Masses, we get a great sense don't we of what that looks like and feels like as a Universal (Catholic) church. As a community we are invited from almost every place on earth. I know having stood in churches and celebrating Masses

in other parts of the world what that really looks like and feels like. I know it will be the same this Sunday as you celebrate here and I celebrate with our brothers and sisters in Sri Lanka. Let's pray for each other this Sunday where ever we might be.

ANNIVERSARY OF BISHOP BILL WRIGHT

William Joseph Wright was born 26 October 1952. Ordained to the priesthood in 1977, he served the parishes of Stanmore, Mount Druitt, Fairfield, Enmore, Dulwich Hill, Bonnyrigg, Moree, Sutherland and Liverpool. He was vice-rector of St Patrick's College in Manly (1985–1991) and assistant secretary to the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference in Canberra in 1995. He was consecrated as the eighth bishop of our diocese, on 15 June 2011. He died on 13 November 2021. We remember him in prayer this weekend.

WHY WE DO WHAT WE DO AT MASS

Symbols of the Mass

Thanks for reading this column, the second in a 15-part reflection on the symbols and gestures that help us enter more deeply into the mystery of the Eucharist.

This week we discuss

The Sign of the Cross ♦

The Sign of the Cross is the first and simplest profession of faith. It expresses who God is and who we are: children of the Father, redeemed by the Son, and strengthened by the Holy Spirit. Every time we trace this sign upon ourselves, we declare our belonging to God and our belief in the mystery of the Trinity.

At the start of Mass, the priest and people together begin *in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit*. This ancient formula reaches back to our baptism, when we were claimed for Christ and marked with His cross.

The gesture itself — forehead, breast, shoulders — reminds us that we are to love God with all our mind, heart, and strength. It is both a prayer and a blessing, opening us to the grace of worship and sealing us in divine love.

Scripture: “*Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.*” — Matthew 28:19


