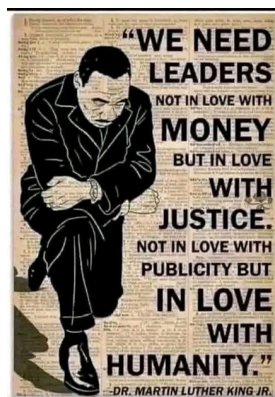
- Some need AA – attention and affection.

This is non-denominational - everyone welcome.

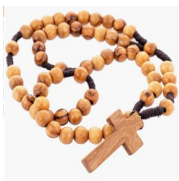
**WHEN:** Monday afternoon 3.30 for 3.45 start.

### Pilgrimage to Sacred Heart Cathedral

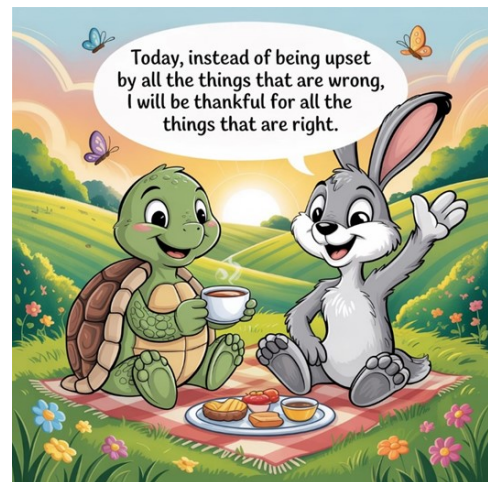

Let's move beyond these conversations to create concrete actions that prevent harm and instead focus on strengthening support systems and empowering our communities to actively protect children.

By shifting conversations into actions, we can each ensure that every child not only feels heard but also experiences safe, caring and protective environments.

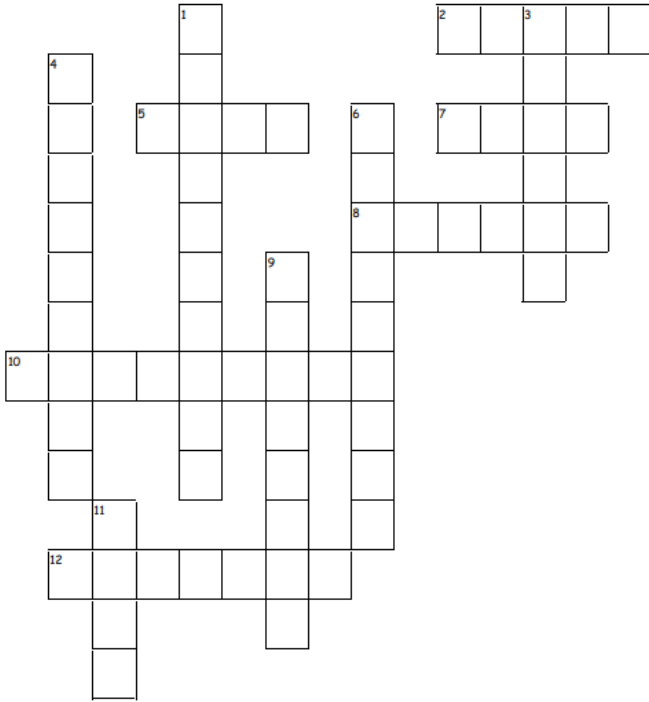
