FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



Dear Parish Family,

On the first weekend in October, the church in Australia will celebrate 'Migrants and Refugees' Sunday, moved to coincide with the Jubilee of Migrants. In Australia a beautiful cross has been designed to mark the journey. An impression of the cross is contained in this bulletin this weekend. It is hard to see all the elements, but you will notice clearly the boat which symbolises the journey that our migrant and refugee brothers and sisters make, often at great risk or hardship, the Southern Cross symbolising the star constellation under which we all live, together with a relic of Mary of the Cross Mackillop, Australia's first saint and a relic of the Holy Family.

I am trying to get a copy of the pilgrimage itinerary for your information. I may have suggested it come here.

As a Catholic Community we should be grateful for the wonderful contribution that many migrants and refugees have made to our Catholic life. I am keen to meet with the many language groups of our local parish community and to hear your stories and to hear some of the elements that you bring, that continue to enhance our Catholic and community life here in this combination of parishes. There are so many ways our life is better for the presence of so many language groups and cultural backgrounds.

For Catholic life in Australia, it has been growing since the first priests arrived with the first Catholic convicts, soldiers and 'settlers'. I say 'settlers' in apostrophe, as some would clearly say invaders. The history hasn't always been good, especially in relationship to First Nations peoples. All, however, in some ways have contributed to the life of the church. We should be grateful for the faith traditions that have supported our Christian life.

You can see the Migrant Jubilee Cross by going on-line to the website. I hope we will get an opportunity to participate in the Pilgrimage, which is part of this great Jubilee of Hope. I include a small piece of information re the Pilgrimage. I also offer the final blessing from the website and suggest that you might pray it each night from now till the 5 October, with your families as you gather each night for a meal or as your grace. There is also a link for those who receive this bulletin online, to a song commissioned for the pilgrimage and written here in Australia.

With every blessing and in gratitude for the diversity of culture, life and language that makes us great in His name.

This is non-denominational - everyone welcome.

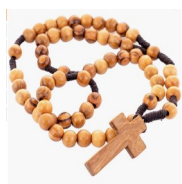

SAFEGUARDING

Keeping children safe during the school holidays.

School holidays are a time for children to take a break from their daily routines and spend it with families and friends. By the pre-teen years, many children are starting to become increasingly independent wanting to do more things without their parents and/or carers around.

Things to share with your children when they're out and about:

- they always tell you/an adult when and where they are going
- if feeling unsafe, tell someone and move to somewhere safer
- avoid playing near driveways and carparks as drivers may not see them
- check their bike's brakes, bell, reflectors and tyres are all working before going for a ride
- correctly wear a helmet when riding any device
- remove their headphones when near traffic so they can hear approaching vehicles
- stop, look, listen, think before they cross the road, and not just follow their friends
- wear bright clothing so drivers can see them, especially when it's twilight
- swim between the red and yellow flags when on the beach.

STELLA MARIS AND MISSION TO SEAFARERS



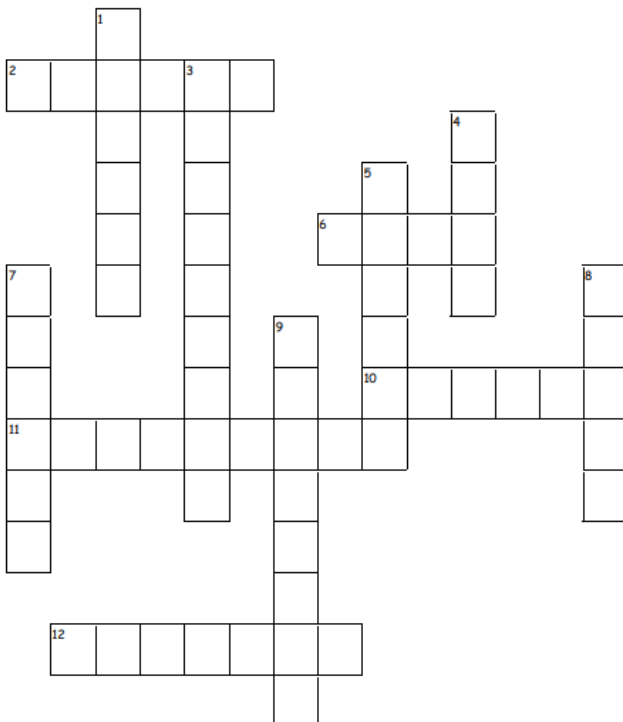
